GENERAL RULES — SHEEP DEPARTMENT

Cecil Goodlett & Jimmie Claycomb – General Co-Superintendents

- **Entry Fee: \$25.00 Per Animal**
- **Late Entry Fee: \$100 Per Animal**
- **All sheep pens will be assigned and tagged by NAILE staff.**
- Please write on your entry form the **number** of pens you **need**. Also special penning requirements, if absolutely necessary, **are required to** be on the entry form. **Do not** call in this information. Upon **arrival** please see NAILE staff in the sheep office for pen assignments. Your **complete** cooperation will be necessary for this to succeed.

Animal Health

- Health Inspections will be conducted prior to entry onto the fairgrounds at the V Lot left of Gate 1 on Phillips Lane.
 - All animals must have a valid Health Paper with Official USDA Identification (including all transit animals).
 - After Health Paper inspection all animals must enter at Gate 1.
 - Gate 1 will be open 24/7.
1. All sheep in purebred classes shall be registered with their respective breed association with the corresponding tag or tattoo listed on that animal's registration paper. Ear tag or ear tattoo, if required by the respective breed association, may be checked in at the show ring before final placing. Judges will be instructed to check mouths of sheep and take weight and size for age in consideration before making their final placing.
 2. All original registration papers for each entry in the sheep show shall be presented to the North American officials at check-in prior to showing. In special circumstances, fax copies will be accepted, but are required to have originated from the breed registry office, and shall include both front and back of registration paper. **NO SWITCHING OR SUBSTITUTING OUT OF CLASS WILL BE ALLOWED AT CHECK-IN; all animals are required to show in class they were entered. Animal substitutions within same class are allowed.** There will be **no** changes on entries after check-in and arm bands are issued.
 3. Not more than three individual entries in any one ram class, nor more than three in any one ewe class (unless class is split) will be accepted, except those Sale Sheep required to show in order to sell. Exhibitor is limited to **one** entry in each group class.
 4. Limit of awards: Livestock exhibitors will not be awarded more than two premiums in any one class and one premium in any one group class. Ribbons shall be presented in the order of placing by the judges. However, third money will be paid to fourth winner, fourth money to fifth winner, etc., when the third winner is prohibited from receiving the third cash award under the provisions of this rule.
 5. Only sheep entered in the shows or sales will be permitted to be penned in the sheep barn. All other sheep shall be kept in trailers or horse barns and are not the responsibility of NAILE.
 6. An animal will only be allowed to exhibit in one breed classification show regardless if it has papers and is eligible for more than one show.
 7. All animals shall be entered and exhibited under the registered name appearing on the records of the breed association. This includes all group classes and premier exhibitor. Jointly owned animals shall be entered and shown under the multi-ownership names appearing on the breed association records and can show in group classes and receive premier exhibitor points with animals of the same ownership.
 8. **All exhibitors are expected to dress neatly.**
 9. **No muzzles will be allowed on breeding sheep.**
 10. Sheep in the show will be subject to vet check by a competent veterinarian before entering the barn. No sheep are allowed to show with visible signs of prolapse. **All sheep** will be monitored for lamb fungus, and any animal with fungus will be dismissed.

11. Sale sheep are released after their sale. Are required to get releases from sale office.
12. Curtains in the exhibitor's pen areas **cannot** be more than 48 inches high. Also, **no** aisles are to be roped off denying access to the public.
13. Anyone removing livestock from the grounds without show management approval (release form) is subject to forfeiture of all premium money. Repeat violators will be subject to further action by the Executive Committee. (Read General Rules #10, 11, and 34.) Early release shall be approved by NAILE staff prior to arrival.
14. Dogs will **not** be permitted on the grounds of the Kentucky Exposition Center during the course of the NAILE show, except those under leash control of the owner. Any dog running free will be impounded and removed from the grounds.
15. Lambing in the sheep barns is prohibited.
16. Exhibitors are required to check in with the sheep department's staff to verify entries and receive class numbers. This process will close at 12:00 noon the day before the breed is to be shown unless showing on Thursday. Animals showing on Thursday will need to be checked in by noon on Tuesday. Any exhibitor not checking in by this deadline or individual entries verified by this deadline will have those entries struck from the respective show.
17. Numbers will be issued for each individual animal entered, and the appropriate number is required to be worn in the corresponding class.
18. All Ewe and Ram Breed Champions are required to parade for Supreme Champion. Premiums and awards will be forfeited if champion is not presented.
- 19. All of the rules and regulations listed in the front of this catalog also apply to the Sheep Department.**
- 20. All early release requests shall be approved by NAILE management prior to October 31.**
- 21. Premier Exhibitor Scoring**

Premier Exhibitor - Computed from winnings: 10 points for first place; 9 points for second place; 8 points for third place; 7 points for fourth place; 6 points for fifth place; 5 points for sixth place; 4 points for seventh place; 3 points for eighth place; 2 points for ninth place; and 1 point for tenth place. Points will be computed from all individual classes and will be awarded only to the registered name appearing on the records of the breed association. Animals do not have to be bred by Exhibitor. Only the two highest placing individuals in any one class will be counted. Only the eight highest placing animals will be counted. No group classes will be counted with the exception of the flock class, which will only be used to break ties.

2. All animals are required to have permanent flock identification, either a legible tattoo or ear tag, that corresponds with the registration certificate. Sheep not having this identification will be barred from competition.
3. Yearlings and senior lambs will vie for Senior Champions. Junior split lamb classes will vie for Junior Champions.
4. In addition to the regular entry fee of \$25.00 per animal, payable to North American International Livestock Exposition, a \$15.00 fee per entry (including pairs and flocks) shall be paid directly to the American Southdown Breeders' Association, P.O. 1. Junior Exhibitors are required to be present to show their own Junior entries unless physically impaired. If two are entered in the same class, another junior is required to show the other entry. Substitute showmen will be considered with prior approval by NAILE staff.
2. To be eligible to exhibit, the exhibitor shall not be more than 21 years of age as of January 1. With no lower age limit for junior exhibitors, the junior should be physically capable of showing their own sheep.
3. All entries subject to General Rules and Regulations. All sheep in purebred classes are required to be registered with their respective breed association and are required to be ear tagged or tattooed with the corresponding tag or tattoo listed on that animal's registration paper. All sheep shall be registered or transferred to current owner by October 10. Current owner is required to be the name of the 4-H, FFA, or Junior Breed Association Member. Partnership entries will be accepted provided all members of the partnership meet the individual breed **age** requirements. **Animals registered in family, farm, chapter, or club name will not be eligible to show in the junior show.** Ear tags or tattoos will be checked in the show ring at the start of each class. Judge will be instructed to check mouths of sheep and take weight and size for age into consideration before making their final selection.
4. All original registration papers for each entry in the sheep show are required to be presented to the North American officials at check-in prior to showing. In order to ensure compliance, blood samples will be drawn from the following animals after the show: 1) Grand Champion Ram and Ewe, 2) Reserve Grand Champion Ram and Ewe, and 3) Any animal whose placing and individual class has been randomly selected for testing prior to the show. For a complete copy of the show policy, please contact the Association office.

1. Age limit for junior exhibitors shall be 21 years old or under on January 1 of this year. There is no lower age limit for junior exhibitors, but each exhibitor is required to be physically capable of controlling and showing their own sheep (handicapped excepted).
2. Junior exhibitors are required to be present to show their own animal unless physically impaired. If the exhibitor has two entries in the same class, another junior exhibitor is required to show one. If one animal is a futurity animal, the owner is required to show it to be awarded futurity points for that class.
3. All Southdowns are required to be **slick shorn** within five days of the show. Wool may be left below the knees and hocks on the legs. Also, wool may be left on the forehead up to the scurs, and wool may be left on the ears.
4. All animals are required to have permanent flock identification, either a legible tattoo or ear tag, that corresponds with the registration certificate. Sheep not having this identification will not be allowed to show.
5. Sheep are required to be registered and recorded with the American Southdown Association by the date listed by each show for proper ownership. Sheep are required to be registered in the junior exhibitor's name. Sheep registered in farm, family, club names, etc., will not be eligible to show in junior shows. All sheep will show in their respective age classes according to their date of birth as recorded on their registration papers. Partnership-owned animals will be accepted provided all partners meet junior exhibitor requirements. A partnership animal can only be shown under one of the partner's names at any one show and cannot be switched at that show between partners.
6. When two people show one animal, the registered owner of the animal is required to be in control of the head at all times. The youth assisting in the ring is required to be within the age requirements posted by the National Junior Southdown Association.
7. All Southdown breeding sheep will be shown with all four feet on the ring surface, except for setting the feet.
8. To qualify for Bred and Owned, dam must be registered in name of the exhibitor or sibling group at the time of breeding. The animal being exhibited must be registered in exhibitor's name at time of show. Any questions or disputes will be evaluated by show management and board members present.

1. Entries in this class may be sponsored by an exhibitor of breeding sheep at the North American International Livestock Exposition. The objective of this class is to present a class of sheep in the most attractive manner, to give spectators a real opportunity to view a style show, and to improve the image of a sheep show and promote wool.
2. A winning garment of prior years cannot be entered again within the same age class.
3. Sheep are required to be registered ewes, any age, conditioned, fitted, and trained to show at halter. All rules for exhibiting sheep at the North American International Livestock Exposition pertain.
4. Entrants chosen by sponsors to participate in this class are required to have a sheep background or sheep interest. The entrant will be judged on the mode of clothing selected, which is required to be attractive and lend elegance to the class. The garment is required to be made of a minimum of 70% wool. Entrants are required to furnish their own garment.
5. Judging Standards: (600 points total)
 - a. Garment Construction 1-100 points
Style and/or Fashion and Accessories 1-100 points
 - b. Entrant's Poise 1-100 points
Entrant's Appearance 1-100 points
 - c. Control of Animal 1-100 points
Presentation and Appearance of Animal 1-100 points

Total possible600 points

First Tiebreaker - Highest score in Style and/or Fashion and Accessories Category. Second Tiebreaker - Highest score in Presentation and Appearance of Animal Category. Third Tiebreaker - Highest score in Entrant's Poise and Appearance.

*Same Judging Standard will be used for the Pairs Class

6. Résumé is required to be completed and emailed to Pat at ohpmyers@gmail.com by October 10, 2023. Résumé shall include name, address, phone number, email, birthdate, breed of sheep being led, brief biography, awards received, hobbies, sheep interests, schooling, and description of garment. Contestants may be penalized or disqualified for résumés of poor quality or excess length. Entry fees and résumés arriving late will **not** be accepted. **No refunds.** Entry forms and résumés may be obtained from the North American International Livestock Exposition at livestockexpo.org. The coordinating outfits should be able to be worn to illustrate not only the beauty of wool, but also fashion. The garments are required to be made of a minimum of 70% wool. No costumes are allowed in the Pairs Class. The same outfit cannot be worn in an individual class and the Pairs class.

2. **No market lambs are allowed in the Horse Barns before the show without superintendent permission.**
3. **Exhibitors are to use all natural bedding (shavings or straw). Mats, garden fabric, or plastic screening of any kind are not allowed. Covering of bedding in pens is not allowed. Pen size in North Wing is 5' X 5' or 6' X 6'.**
4. The humane treatment of all livestock is required and shall include, but not be limited to, feeding, watering, and caring for all animals in a proper manner as determined by show management.
5. **No painting on market wethers is allowed.** Anyone using artificial coloring on lambs will be disqualified and subject to further action by the Executive Committee.
6. **No wethers with visible signs of prolapse allowed in the barn.**
7. To be eligible to exhibit in the Junior Wether Show, the exhibitor is required to not be more than 21 years of age and at least six years old as of January 1.
8. Junior exhibitors are required to be present to show their own Junior entries unless physically impaired. If two or more are entered in the same class, another junior is required to show one of them. Any exception is required to be in writing and approved by the Superintendent by 8:00 a.m. the day of the show.
9. The premium money will be prorated. Ten places will be paid in each class.
10. The top five wether lambs will be selected from the breed Champions and Reserves. After selection, Grand and Reserve Grand will become property of NAILE.

12. Weights are required to be turned in via QR Code Submission for each wether by 4:00 p.m. Thursday, November 9, 2023. The weight indicated on the card will be the declared show weight of the wether. Scales will be available for the exhibitor's use until show time. By submitting the weight via QR Code Submission, the exhibitor/owner agrees to all NAILE rules and regulations, including ownership and code of ethics. All violations will be reviewed by the Exposition management and/or the Executive Committee.
13. Classifying – Exhibitors are required to indicate on weight card the breed of each entry. All lambs will be classified at the time of judging by a three person committee. If the animal is classified out, it will be sifted into the WFX or BFX show.
14. There will be no changing of weight or breeds after the weight cards have been turned in.
15. After each class of wethers is placed, only the top five wethers will be weighed on the official scales in the showing by show officials. If any wether is more than five pounds above its declared show weight, it will be disqualified and the remaining wethers will move up in placing. The disqualified wether is not eligible for any other class and will not be reweighed.
16. The wethers will be shown in classes by weight and by breed. All wethers are required to have a lower weight limit of 95 pounds, actual weight at re-weigh, with no upper weight limit. Show Management reserves the right to adjust class numbers and breaks as needed with a maximum of 35 classes total. Hair sheep wethers will have a minimum weight of 75 pounds.
17. Blackface crossbred will be broken into a minimum of three divisions, light, medium, and heavyweight. The Division Champions will then compete for Blackface Cross Champion.
18. A minimum of 15 entries are required to be checked in for any one breed to be eligible for a separate breed show. Breeds with fewer than 15 head will go into the All Other Breeds class.
19. Only two premiums per owner will be awarded in any one class.
20. Exhibitors are allowed to enter eight total animals - commercial ewes and market wethers combined. However, each exhibitor is limited to entering or showing a maximum of six (6) wethers in the Junior Market Wether Show.
21. All wethers will be released after the show on Sunday, November 12, 2023 except the Grand Champion and Reserve Champion. There will be no carcass contest. All wethers are required to be removed from the barn on Sunday November 12, 2023.
22. **Attention:** There are plans for a market to sell your lambs on Sunday, November 12, 2023. If you sell your lambs, the checks will be issued at the time of loading.
23. The top five market wethers will be drug tested. Random animals may also be selected for drug testing. At time of testing, Animal Affidavit Forms will be available to provide information of any medication given that the animal could test positive for. For additional rules and information, please refer to the National Code of Show Ring Ethics in the General Rules starting on page xvii.
24. All Grand and Reserve Champion animals will be processed, and the carcasses and hides of each animal will be inspected and evaluated for tampering. This would include but is not limited to inspection of the carcass and hide for injection sites that do not conform to typical animal husbandry practices. Any animal with an abnormal carcass or hide due to the injection of air or any other substance in order to alter the conformation or appearance of an animal may be subject to disqualification including loss of premiums, prizes, and awards received. Exhibitors may also be banned from future competition.

The Continental Dorset Club (CDC) will award \$500 to the Champion Dorset Wether and \$250 to the Reserve Champion Dorset Wether in accordance with the requirements being met of the Continental Dorset Club Wether Incentive Program. Complete requirements of the program are posted on the CDC website at: dorsets.homestead.com. Winning wethers are required to be registered with the CDC prior to show date and be in the individual exhibitor's name. **No post show registration applications will be accepted.** The exhibitor is required to be a youth member of the CDC, and no ewe lambs are eligible. The original registration certificate is required to be presented to the CDC official present immediately following the show for identification and ownership verification on the lamb.

Hampshire

The American Hampshire Sheep Association, P.O. Box 231, 305 Lincoln St., Wamego, KS 66547, offers \$50.00 to the exhibitor of the Grand Champion Wether, if sired by a registered Hampshire Ram. The sire's association number and a picture of the Grand Champion shall be submitted within 60 days to the AHSA office to receive this award.

Montadale

The Montadale Sheep Breeders' Association, Inc., 32649 W. 171st Court, Gardner, KS 66030, offers \$50.00 to the exhibitor of the Champion Montadale Wether (or the highest placing Montadale if Montadales are shown in the AOB class). A photo of the wether, together with the sire and dam registration numbers, shall be submitted to the association office within 60 days to receive these awards.

Oxford

The American Oxford Sheep Association (9305 Zollman Rd, Marysville, IN 47141) offers an additional premium of \$75.00 to the exhibitor of the champion Oxford Wether if it is a purebred Oxford. The premium will be paid from the American Oxford Sheep Association office. A photo of the wether and exhibitor, the name of the breeder, and the registration numbers of both the sire and the dam shall be submitted to the association office within 60 days following the show to receive this premium.

Shropshire

The American Shropshire Registry Association, 41 Bell Rd., Leyden, MA 01337, will offer a premium of \$50.00 to the exhibitor of the Champion Shropshire Wether if it is a purebred Shropshire. This premium will be paid from the American Shropshire Registry office.
